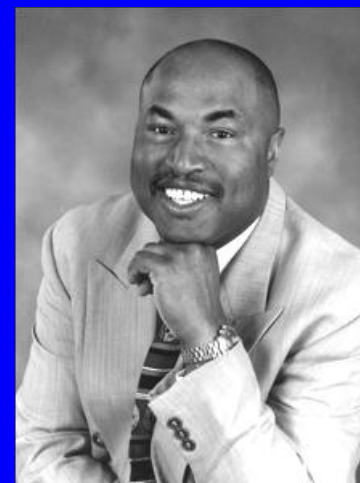

What We Learned From 40 Past Seminars

1. Why is the Seminar a Good Idea?

- a. Teachers and administrators from many states have been able to use the information immediately.
- b. Several districts instituted division-wide initiatives that allowed them to maximize the impact of the seminar.
- c. Superintendents used the strategies to write their district plans, while principals used them to write their annual school plans.

2. How Did Participants Get the Most Out of These Seminars?

Most schools and districts sent a team. A team of at least 5 to 7 members is strongly recommended. One school sent 20 people. **This allowed them to:**

- a. Delegate responsibility for specific topics to each team member.
- b. Debrief afterwards and decide how the strategies could best help their school.
- c. Decide whom to approach and present the information to first.
- d. Brainstorm how to present the information to all.
- e. Support each other during the year to continue to follow through on initiatives and programs started.
